Monitoring and Observation Networks in Germany

Activites in Germany

- National Biodiversity Monitoring Programmes well established
 - Bird monitoring
 - High nature value (HNV)-farmland Monitoring
 - Habitats-Directive-Monitoring & special surveys
 - Marine Monitoring
 - Ecosystem monitoring (first national pilot)
 - Insect monitoring (under development)
- German Red List Centre
 - Central coordination of the national Red Lists
 - Offers technical guidance
 - Cooperates with network of about 550 Red List authors



National Biodiversity Monitoring Centre

Founded in January 2021

Will be built up over the next two years

Targets and goals

- Promote synergies between monitoring programmes in Germany
- Further develop biodiversity monitoring in Germany
- > Support development of monitoring methods
- Facilitate information access for universities and other research units
- Develop and implement a national information platform on monitoring programmes and data
- Collaborate in international and European activities



Perspectives for Monitoring in Europe

Well established cooperation

- between national authorities and EU-institutions for EUdirectives and international conventions
- for networking species monitoring in Europe (e.g. for butterflies and birds)

Questions to be adressed in the future

- How can research institutions support monitoring, which gaps can be filled?
- > Develop methods and analysis techniques to provide services from satellite data for conservation purposes
- ➤ Standardise and make available relevant information on pressures like legal/illegal taking of species, input of chemicals and excess nutrient input etc. across Europe
